Communication Procedures

- 1. **Class Teacher** Please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance.
- 2. Acting Assistant Headteacher (Mrs. Grieve) If you feel your concern has not been resolved, please arrange to discuss it with Mrs. Grieve.
- 3. Acting Headteacher (Mrs. Rees) If you remain dissatisfied, you may then request a meeting with Mrs. Rees.
- 4. Chair of Governors (Mrs. Kath Jones) Finally, if you are still unhappy, you may contact Mrs. Jones directly.

It is very important that we follow this process so that concerns can be addressed fairly and effectively.
